4. HOUSE EP / MORATO ARQUITETURA

Bring together a young executive with a bold vision, an award-winning architect with an innate interpretative talent and a Brazilian hillside of mountainous grandeur, you'll find the results astounding and magnificent: the House EP. Reaching both skyward and outward towards the lush valley below, the modern structure imbues a sense of bold confidence with its sharp angles, jutting forms and brilliant white façade anchored by a vivid vast red wall.

While evidently Brazilian modernist in style, many Portuguese colonial architectural elements were used along with regional materials and constructive techniques. A main focus of the home is the relationship between

the homeowners and the exuberant natural landscape. Thus the contrast between geometric design and natural organic shapes which brings about dual feelings of both peace and progress.

Clad in massive glass and white walls, the home's three stories climb the hillside. The first story, created with daily living in mind, boasts a spacious living space opening itself to the mountains and valley beyond. Minimal furnishings congregate in conversation and activity areas. The crisp white interior is brought to life by the brilliant red wall that spans the back of the house from the exterior through the interior.
